WHAT IS SCOUTING

In Cub Scouting, you'll have lots of fun, adventure, and activities with your den and pack. But there's more to it than that. Being a Cub Scout means you are a member of a worldwide youth movement that stands for certain values and beliefs. Cub Scouting is more than something to do. It's all about the boy you *are* and the person you will *become*.

CUB SCOUTS DO THINGS AND GO PLACES

Cub Scouting is fun! No matter what grade you are in, K through 5th, it can be a blast. Do you like to learn by doing? This is just the place. You can learn to tie knots, set up a tent, shoot a bow and arrow (archery). Have you ever cooked a meal on a campfire? Sent a secret code to a buddy? Build a bird house? Play Ultimate? Hike? Earn rewards for doing these things in CubScouts.

CUBS SCOUTS EARN AWARDS

Each time you complete an accomplishment or learn a new skill you will be rewarded. Sometimes the reward is a bead or a patch. Sometimes it is a smile on your parent's face to see you grown and learn.



YOUTH LITERATURE

Each Cub Scout has a handbook to help them along their trail. Tiger Cubs use the Tiger Cub Handbook with activities in the Den, at home, and the community. Wolf Cubs have a handbook that will help them along the Wolf Trail where they learn more about themselves and their families. Bear Cubs have a handbook that takes them farther, but they get to choose the achievements they complete. Webelos have a larger handbook with 20 Activity Badges; they can work on in the 2 years they are Webelos.

CUB SCOUT TIGER CUB HANDBOOK

This book for first-grade boys and their adult partners tells about the Tiger Cub program and gives information about dens, leaders, uniforms, and advancement.

CUB SCOUT WOLF HANDBOOK

Second-grade boys use this book as they move along the trail to earn their Wolf badge.

CUB SCOUT BEAR HANDBOOK

Boys in the third grade do the achievements in this book to earn their Bear badge.

CUB SCOUT WEBELOS HANDBOOK

Boys who are in the fourth or fifth grade use this handbook as Webelos Scouts. Everything in the Webelos Scout program is more challenging than what younger boys in the pack do.
